What is History?

The craft of the historian, how can we become good Historians?



Why was England conquered in 1066?

Examination of what led to the Invasion of England in 1066



How did the Romans change Britain?

Examining pre 1066 Britain and the impact of the Romans on people who lived and worked these



How powerful was the Medieval Church?

Focus on the structure, importance and effect of medieval religion, including the murder of Thomas Becket



Extended Learning Project: Castle!

Examine defensive structures throughout history with a focus on local defensive structures



Was 1348 really the end of the world?

A study of the bubonic plague epidemics of the 1300's. Examining all aspects of the disease and drawing comparison to modern day



Why was Jerusalem worth dying for?

A study of medieval Europe and the Islamic world. Examining different Crusades and impact that the Islamic world had on Europe

How did Sussex change in the medieval period - Exeant plague village, coastline, 100 years war



Why were the peasants revolting?

Close up exploration of the Peasants Revolt and how the balance of power has shifted over time

Extended Learning Project - The English Civil War

Students examine an aspect of the English Civil War in detail

Focusing on the lives and experiences of the population during the Tudor times



What was Slavery and how did it develop?

Understanding the origins, mechanics, experiences and legacy of the Slave Trade, with links to modern day representations



Was the British Empire good or bad?

Study of the development of the British Empire, a case study of India and making a judgement on the British Empire



Extended Learning Project: The Greatest Briton

Students research and debate who they believe was the Greatest Briton - an opportunity to study political, cultural, industrial and popular figures in History



How did Britain change during the Industrial Revolution?

A look at developments in all aspects of British life during the industrial revolution, including mining, farming, populations, transport, culture and politics



Why was it difficult to catch Jack the Ripper?

Examining all aspects of the Jack the Ripper case - the victims, policing, suspects and modern theories

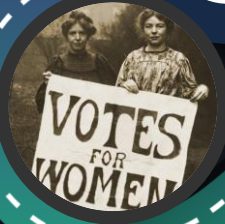

M.A.I.N.S Causes of World War 1

How Militarism, Alliances, Imperialism, Nationalism and Significant Individuals all lead to the outbreak of WW1

Extended learning Project: The Interwar Years

Exploring of any aspect of the interwar years such as the rise of the dictators, Anna Anderson, America in the 1920's or other ideas



How successful was Winston Churchill as a WW2 leader?

In-depth study of WW2 using the leadership of Winston Churchill to evaluate success



How useful is Anne Frank's diary?

Looking at the Holocaust in all aspects and evaluating the utility of diary sources



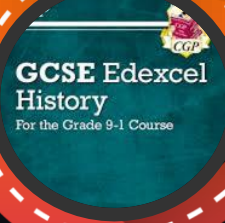
Power to the people: How did the ordinary become extraordinary?

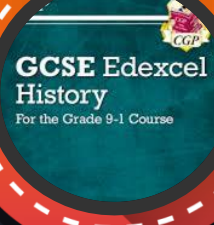
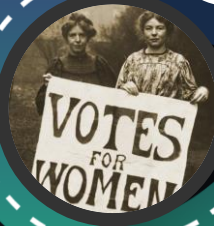

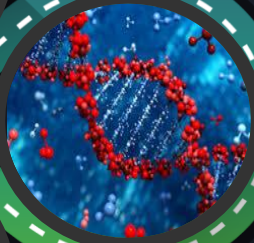
