


A copy of the 2 week timetable has been sent home to students for your reference, dates can also be found on the school calendar.

COVID Update

Winter approaches we are expecting an increase of COVID infections across the country.

We just wanted to update with with the current guidance on student illnesses and absences.

Any student that presents with any symptoms like having a temperature, sore throat, no taste and cold like symptoms will be asked to return

home and requested that they take a lateral flow test or PCR test.

Students should stay isolated at home until the results come back from the PCR test

You should then follow the advise that comes back with the test results as to what to do next. If positive please inform the attendance team at school and the student must isolate for 10 days from when the PCR test was conducted.

As parents know as part of our transition to the Turing School, Swales Academies Trust are very kindly provided all students in Years 7 to 10 with a new Turing uniform in September.


Students received a new blazer, tie, PE top and PE shorts.

PARENTPAY PAYMENT SYSTEM

Many parents will know that in school we use the payment system called ParentPay for students to pay for their school lunches and break time snacks. Parents can simply open a ParentPay account online and add money to the account either by credit/debit card or if you do not have one of these by adding cash at any store that shows the PayPoint logo.

We have now extended this system so parents can now pay for their child's food technology payments online and we will also start to use it for future upcoming school trips.

We have become a cashless school from September with all payments being made virtually. This not only saves much time processing money but also is more secure for staff and students.

If you have not yet set up a ParentPay account, its quick and easy to do. To get started simply email us at school at tts-office@swale.at and we will send you your activation code in an email which will outline what you need to do.

We will also be adding other payment items such as trips and tickets for events very soon, we will also be able to accept card payments in the main office starting from November.



STUDENT HOMEWORK

Please note that as a school we have stopped using the Show My Homework website for issuing student homework.

We will be using 1 simple channel going forward to log homework. This will be found all under the Google Classroom app that students have already been using over the last year. Students should have no trouble finding all their logged homework which will include due dates.

Parents will not have a function to be able to login and see what has been set like we previously had with Show My Homework, but they will be able to see by getting your child to login first to view the set work. Students should email their teachers if they encounter any problems.

MY CHILD AT SCHOOL

Last May we introduced to parents our new online communication platform called My Child at School (MCAS). This replaced our old system Edulink and is just as quick and easy to use.

Parents are able to report absences, contact their child's teachers, monitor students attendance, check timetables and view the school calendar, view recent student reports as well as many more features which will be added soon.
