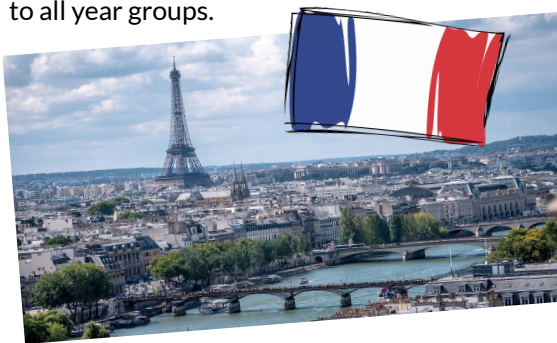
We hope you all have a lovely half term break, enjoying the Royal Jubilee celebrations, hopefully with lots of warm sunny weather.

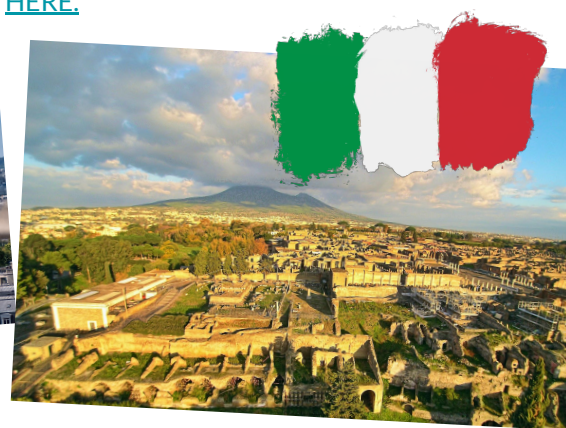

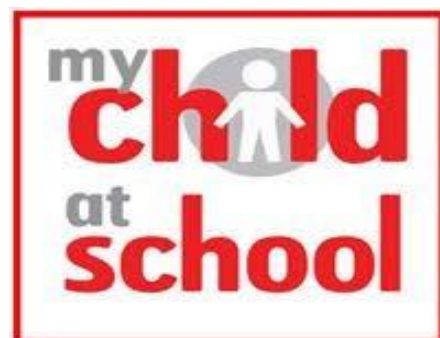
We look forward to our remaining athletic event, especially Town Sport and Sport Day.

The Turing School Wins Grant

We are delighted to have been awarded £3,000 from the The Ormiston Trust.

The Ormiston Trust is a grant giving trust that primarily supports schools and organisations that provide direct assistance to children, young people, and families across England. As a match funder awarding grants on the behalf of the #iwill Fund, the Ormiston Trust is offering open grants of up to £5,000 over a 9 to 12-month period to support the embedding of sustainable youth social action at scale in schools.

The grant of £3000 will allow students at The Turing School to make a positive contribution to the local community.

In September we will be forming our first ever Social Action Committee - the TTS Social Action Committee will take action on local, national and potentially global issues. The Social Action Committee will ensure that students can become young leaders in service whilst instilling the schools Core Values: Respect, Aspiration, Innovation and Diversity.

New Eco Committee

The Turing Eco Committee was relaunched just this term but has already become popular, with more than 15 members currently. Students arrived with lots of amazing ideas to improve their school environment! The Eco Committee aims are to make The Turing School a wildlife friendly and ecologically aware environment. Initial meetings agreed on some short term and long term projects that the Committee aims to work on.

Currently this term we have already designed an Eco garden, sown wildflower seeds to create a wildflower meadow to attract birds, bees, butterflies and bats, sown vegetable seeds to grow different foods to try, designed and ordered planters for the front of school (look out for these next term), undertaken a survey of 'weeds' to see what wonders we have growing and Sent students to visit the Knepp Estate to learn about rewilding.

Future tasks include a wildlife pond, bat boxes, bird feeders and replanting the courtyard of the school; in addition to installing recycling bins and encouraging all staff and students to think about their impact on the natural world. Ms Griffiths is hoping to ask volunteers from local groups to come in and speak with the Committee about the importance of conservation and how we can all help. New members are always welcome, we meet in F5 every Thursday lunchtime.
