# The Duke of Edinburgh Award

Our School has now got the Duke of Edinburgh License so all systems are go with our launch of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme.

Saturday the 28th of January saw our beach clean group head out with litter pickers and rubbish bags to clean under and around the pier.

The year 9 students are completing 3 months of this for their volunteering section of the award which is one of the four they need to complete for the Award.



The students also need to complete a physical and skills section and then complete the expedition which will be in May/June.

The group of year 9 and 10 students meet every friday lunchtime to learn how to use the DofE app to record their evidence for the sections and also learn about the countryside code, how to put up a tent, how to use the outdoor trangia cookers and how to navigate around the South Downs using a map and a compass recognising landmarks to check correct positioning.

Year 7 boys took part in only their second football fixture on Tuesday (31st January). Their opponents on the day were Willingdon Community School. On a sunny but cold day the boys gave it their absolute all, showing the true values by never giving up. Despite losing 4-1 they gave Willingdon plenty to worry about with multiple shots on target. 

# CELEBRATING TOP STUDENT WORK



Year 7 in textiles have been designing and making bags for life. They are using the theme of food and food packaging. To make these they use tie dye to add colour and pattern to their fabric. The students design and make their own stencils and print them. They then are able to add heat transfer and embroidery detail. They then learn how to use the sewing machines using a straight stitch to hem the opening of the bags, attach handles and construct their bags with a seam. Some of the bags have been left behind so please can these be collected from F22, Some have not been completed but can be in textiles club wednesdays after school.

In year 8 students have been designing and making Graffiti and doodles themed Cushion covers using batik to decorate the background, dip dye and applique. The students are then able to insert a zip using the sewing machine and construct the cushion cover with a seam. These are some of the outcomes If the students were not able to finish they can complete on a wednesday after school in textiles club till 4pm Some of these still need to be collected.
