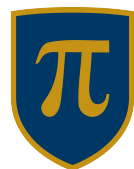

Bugsy Malone Success



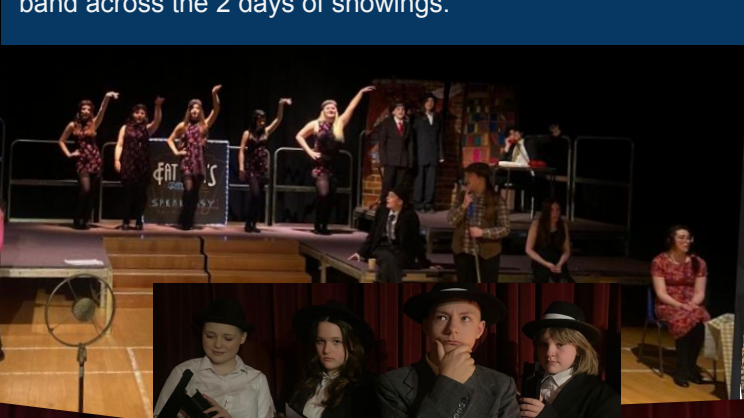
Well done to all the cast and crew who have worked for months on bringing our latest school production to life.

Bugsy Malone tells the story of the rise of "Bugsy Malone" and the battle for power between "Fat Sam" and "Dandy Dan". Set in New York City, it is a gangster spoof, substituting machine guns that fire gobs of whipped cream instead of bullets.

The story is based loosely on events in New York and Chicago during Prohibition era, specifically the exploits of real-life gangsters such as Al Capone and Bugs Moran.

Our talented students have been rehearsing for the last 6 months and performed the show over 2 days, including performing to local primary schools as well as the 2 evening performances to the public.

This has been a whole school effort in the production with other subjects such as art and design, who brought the sets to life. Also our talented musicians from music who manned the band across the 2 days of showings.

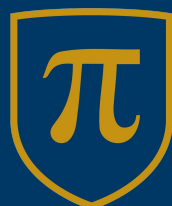
