The Turing School Italian Takeover



45 of our students got to have a magical 4 day trip to Sorrento in Italy. This was to be a packed trip visiting some of the greatest sites in Italy. 3 of our students who took part were Remy, Darby and Izzy, below is their account of what they did each day:

On the first day we visited Herculaneum; a treasured historical site ,which was subducted beneath a pyroclastic flow that pervaded over the area (in 79AD) resulting in the buildings becoming dilapidated ruins. We separated into small groups and proceeded to explore the ruins alongside our friends and studied the historical value of the heritage site (20 hectares).

After visiting the ruins we were on our way to the hotel in the coach, which drove alongside the edge of a cliff that gave a beautiful panorama of the coast of Sorrento. The hotel was a beach-side hotel that gave a picturesque view of the pulchritudinous ocean and served us an abundance of delicious pasta and other Italian dishes that we ate for dinner.

On day 2 we visited the infamous Mount Vesuvius (or Vesuvio as we learnt in Italian) which is a dormant volcano with its most recent eruption being in 1944. We once again separated into smaller groups as we set the goal of conquering Mount Vesuvius, it was a tedious and strenuous incline that only some of us were able to beat. Consequently, the view from the top was breathtaking as a sense of idiosyncrasy was created from the volcano bordering the ancient city. Walking at a continuous pace the walk up took approximately 50 minutes and the walk down took around 30 minutes where we brought some items at the market stalls situated at the bottom such as necklaces, crystals and magnets.

Finally, we visited the ancient ruins of one of the most famous historical events, "Pompeii". Pompeii had a surplus of tumultuous tourists exploring the ruins (compared to Herculaneum) which were guided by tour guides around the heritage site. Once again we separated into groups as we spent approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes exploring the meticulous details on the walls of the ancient ruins and exploring the surrounding areas. We saw how the ancient ruins were maintained for tourist attraction and where everything was located and the backstory behind some of the houses (ruins).

We even got to see the famous caecilius's house (which mr Robbin was very happy about) and the amphitheatre that would've been used by the Romans. After we studied and explored the historical grounds of Pompeii we visited an authentic pizzeria on the peaceful hills of Sorrento where we were able to try and make the dough for a traditional Italian pizza. After making the dough, we went inside the pizzeria where we ate a traditional mozzarella pizza for dinner while we watched some Italian dancers who danced with castanets and tambourines. They even invited some of the students to dance alongside them, it was a wonderful experience!

On day 3 we visited the prepossessing island of Capri. We arrived around 9:30 am on the island by taking a boat, where we walked alongside the coast (the docks) and took in the sites of the alluring island. Around 10:30 am we regrouped at the docks to go on a boat tour of the island, which had great geographical benefits; we got to see caves, arches, stacks and stumps while the boat cascaded across the beautiful, blue water. We went around the entire island, allowing us to see beautiful vegetation and amazing cliffs which included gorgeous stalagmites. The entirety of the tour approximately took 1 hour and 30 minutes.

After the boat tour we arrived back at the docks of Capri. Capri is a stunning island with 80% of people on the island on any day being tourists. Once we arrived back at the docks we got tickets for the funicular, a tram that takes you up to the top of Capri. Once we arrived at the top, after awaiting everyone's arrival, we were allowed to explore the bustling area buy items and get some food. After about 2 hours we all relocated at the meeting point and separated into two groups.

One group took the funicular back down, the other group walking down to the bottom. Once we all got to the bottom and regrouped we went back to the docks and took a boat back to the coast of Sorrento. We arrived at the coast and took the coaches back to the hotel, our humble abode for the time we are in Italy.

On our final day, we didn't have a sufficient amount of time to discover or do anything major, however, on our way to the airport we visited ruins of an ancient Roman villa, it was incredible and the backstory behind some of the rooms and locations was truly amazing. After visiting the Roman Villa ruins and taking pictures we got back to the coaches and soon arrived at the airport. Finally returning home to England.

We all had a wonderful experience and really enjoyed the trip.
