TURING, HERE WE COME

Preparations are now well underway for our transition from Causeway to The Turing School in September.

Many parents may be wondering why we are changing name and why we are going to be called The Turing School, so here's a brief background on Alan Turing.


The Turing School is being named after Alan Turing, a world renowned English Mathematician born in 1954. He is well known for being highly influential in the development of theoretical computer science, providing a formalisation of the concepts of algorithm computation with the Turing machine. which can be considered a model of a modern day computer.

During the Second World War, Turing worked for the Government Code and Cypher School at Bletchley Park, Britain's codebreaking centre. For a time he led Hut 8, the section that was responsible for German naval cryptanalysis. Here, he devised a

number of techniques for Speeding up the breaking of German ciphers, including inventing the Enigma machine.

Turing played a crucial role in cracking intercepted coded messages that enabled the Allies to defeat the Nazis in many crucial engagements.

It is estimated that this work shortened the war in Europe by more than two years and saved over 14 million lives.



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Many of his achievements were never known about during his lifetime as a lot of his work was covered under the official secrets act, and during the 1950's he was persecuted by the British legal system because of his sexual orientation which ultimately led to his sad premature death in 1954.

It was only from the 1960's we learnt about a lot of the great work he did on behalf of his country and in 2009 the Government officially apologized for Queen Elizabeth II his treatment. granted Turing a posthumous pardon in 2013 which paved the way for The Alan Turing Law to be introduced in 2017.

He is now celebrated for his outstanding work and contributions to our country and this is why we are proud to have him at the forefront of our new school, our vision and within our core values which we look forward to sharing with you at the beginning of the new school year.

As parents know as part of our transition to the Turing School, Swales Academies Trust are very kindly providing all students in Years 7 to 10 with a new Turing uniform from September.


Students will receive a new blazer, tie, PE top and PE shorts. This can be collected from school on 26th & 27th August between 10am - 2pm.

PARENTPAY PAYMENT SYSTEM

Many parents will know that in school we use the payment system called ParentPay for students to pay for their school lunches and break time snacks. Parents can simply open a ParentPay account online and add money to the account either by credit/debit card or if you do not have one of these by adding cash at any store that shows the PayPoint logo.

We have now extended this system so parents can now pay for their child's food technology payments online and we will also start to use it for future upcoming school trips.

We will become a cashless school from September with all payments being made virtually. This not only saves much time processing money but also is more secure for staff and students.

If you have not yet set up a ParentPay account, its quick and easy to do. To get started simply email us at school at tts-office@swale.at and we will send you your activation code in an email which will outline what you need to do.

We will also be adding our GCSE revision guides to this system from September when we will be able to offer over 20 guides covering most of our GCSE subjects.



STUDENT HOMEWORK

Please note that as a school we have stopped using the Show My Homework website for issuing student homework.

As of September will will be using 1 simple channel going forward to log homework. This will be found all under the Google Classroom app that students have already been using over the last year.

Students should have no trouble finding all their logged homework which will include due dates.

Parents will not have a function to be able to login and see what has been set like we previously had with Show My Homework, but they will be able to see by getting your child to login first to view the set work.

MY CHILD AT SCHOOL

During Term 5 we introduced to parents our new online communication platform called My Child at School.

This replaced our old system Edulink and is just as quick and easy to use.

Parents are able to report absences, contact their child's teachers, monitor students attendance, check timetables and view the school calendar, view recent student reports as well as many more features which will be added soon.
